Preparedness Phase



Emergency Services Activation:

Activate Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs) to manage real-time coordination.



Coordination:

Coordinate with local, state, and federal agencies, as well as emergency services and community organizations.



Community Preparation:

Distribute safety information, encourage evacuation, and ensure access to shelters.



Resource Allocation:

Stockpile supplies, prepare emergency equipment, and preposition resources like food, water, and medical aid.

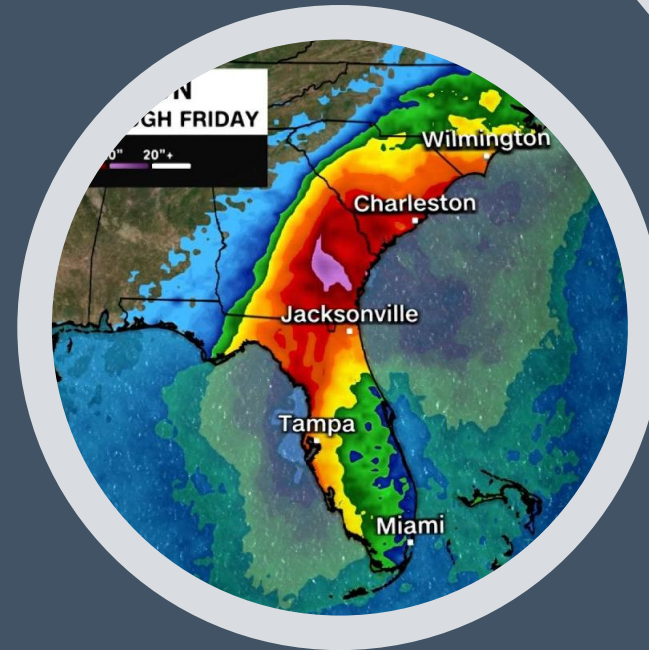
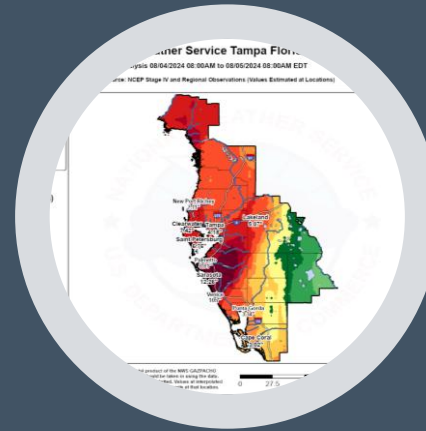

Rainfall totals - Manatee County experienced rainfall totals that were equivalent to 100- and 500-year events. The SRQ Airport weather station recorded nearly 12 inches of rain, a record daily rainfall. Rain gauges in the county recorded totals ranging from 4 inches in the east to over 14 inches in the southwest.

Flooding - Many areas experienced flooding for the first time, and some neighborhoods were still underwater days after the storm. The Centre Lake neighborhood was among those affected, with some residents using paddle boards to access their homes.

Damage - Manatee County officials estimated that Debby caused \$56 million in residential and business damages.

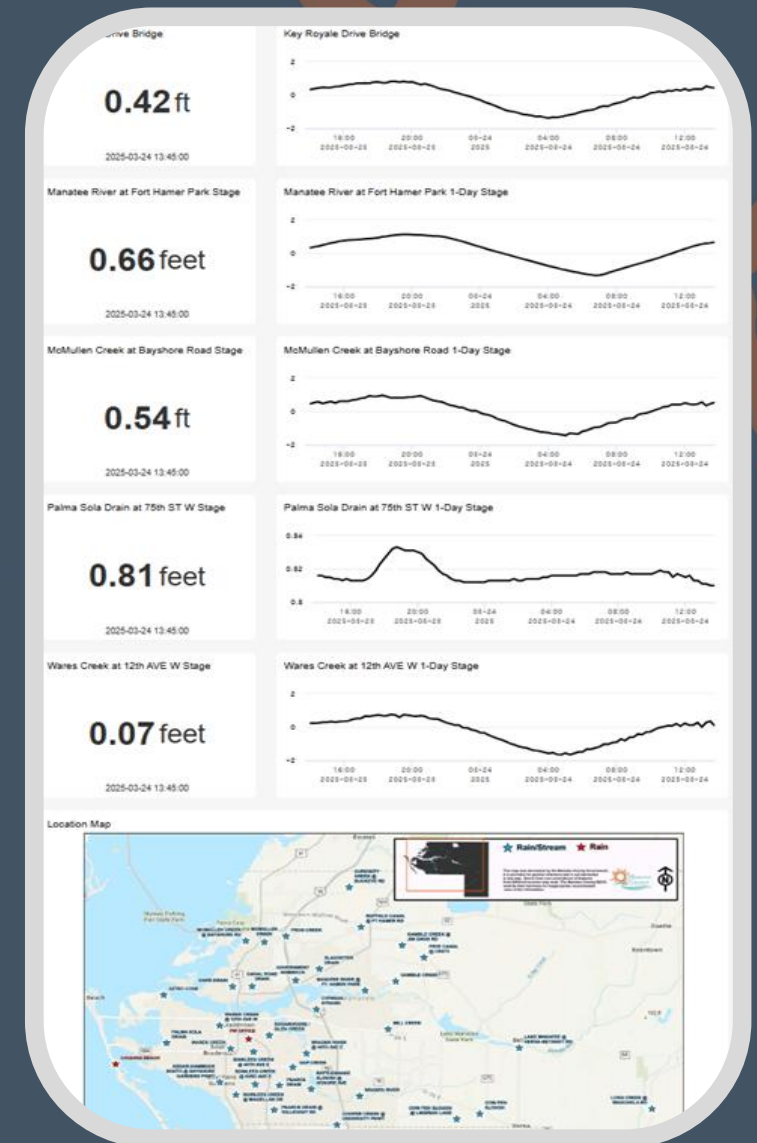
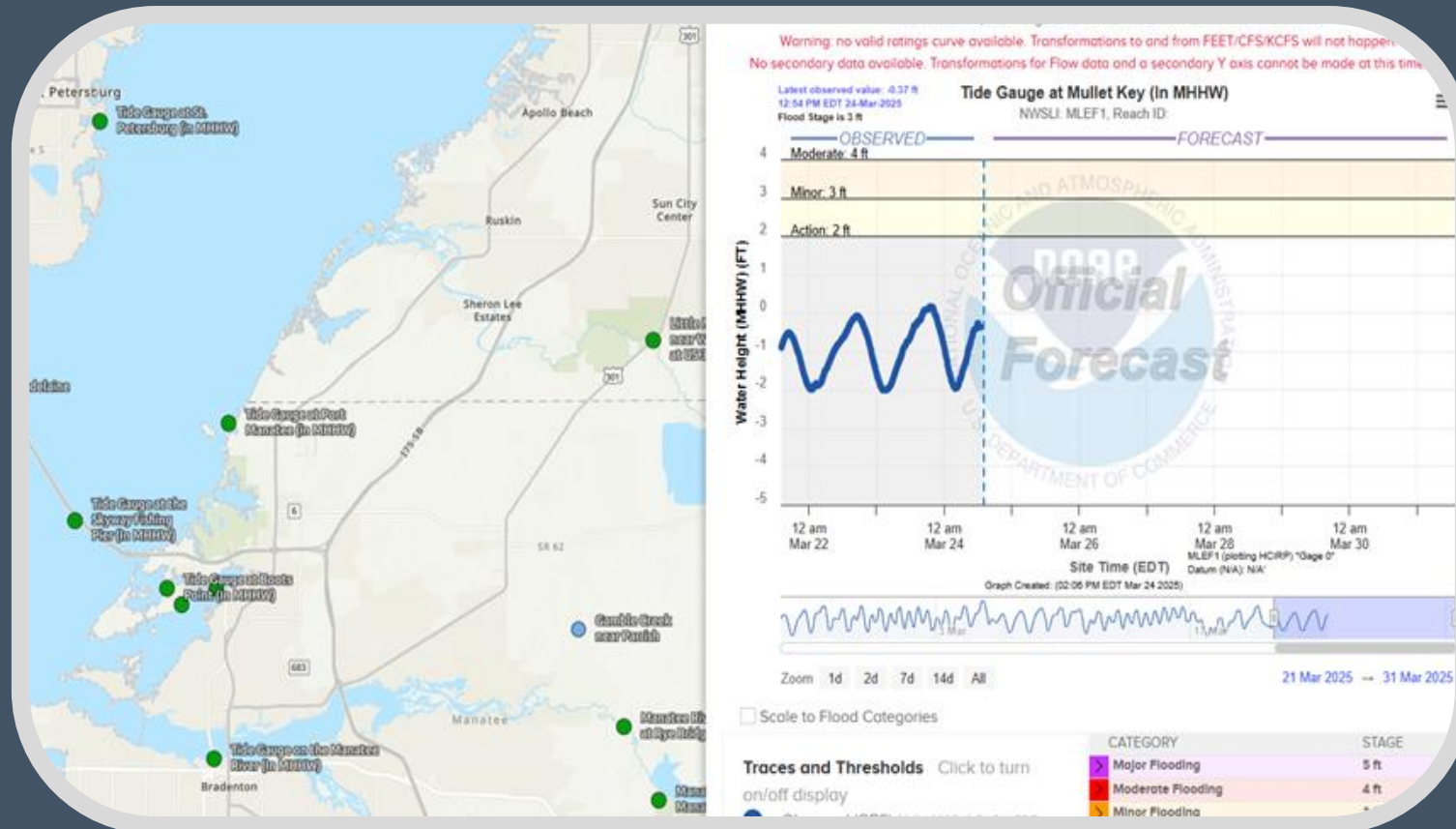
Water releases from Lake Manatee - To protect the dam and drinking water supply, Manatee County released approximately 15 billion gallons of water from Lake Manatee during the storm.



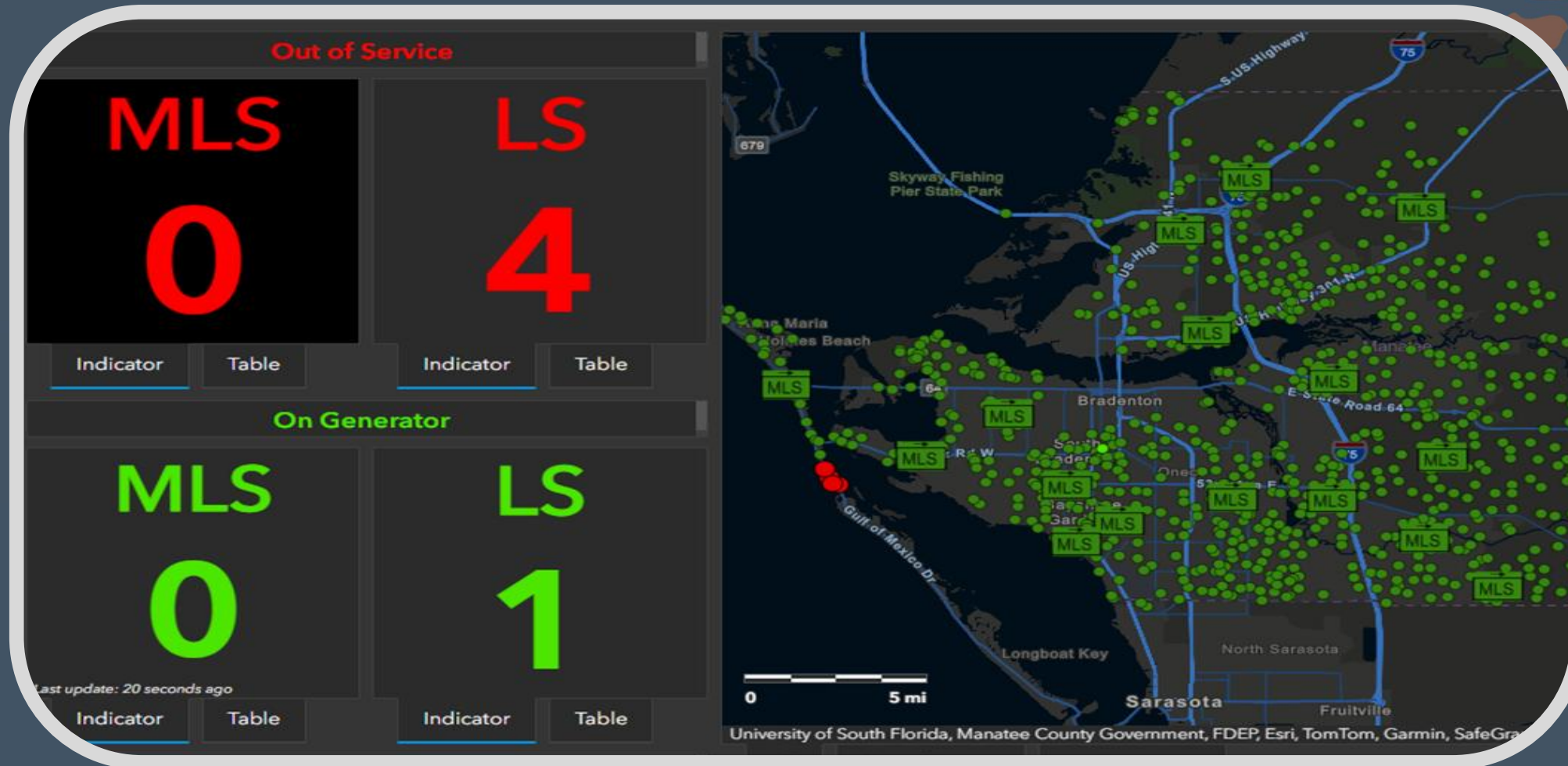

Response Phase



Monitoring and Planning:

Track the storm's progress and issue early alerts. Develop response and evacuation plans.



Life-Saving Efforts:

Focus on rescue operations, medical aid, and sheltering evacuees.



Public Safety Alerts:

Provide real-time updates about the storm's movement, safety measures, and emergency contact points.



Critical Infrastructure Protection:

Monitor and respond to issues like power outages, flooding, and transportation disruptions.



HELENE SURGE

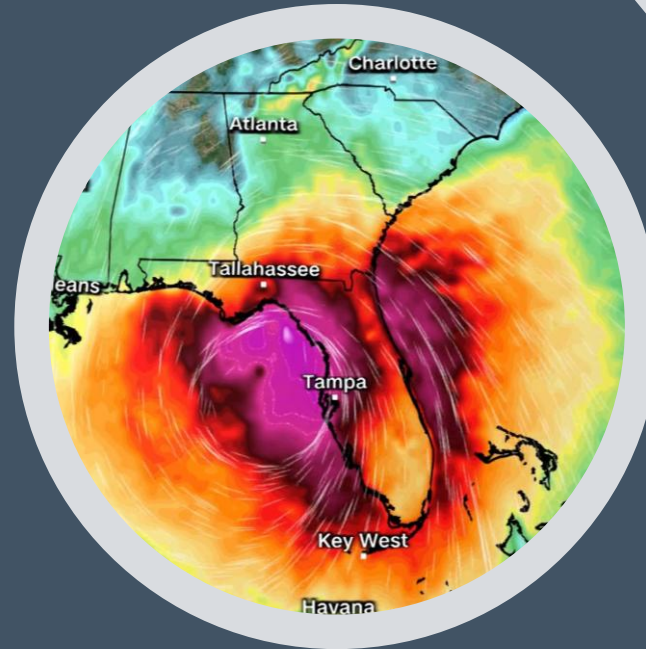
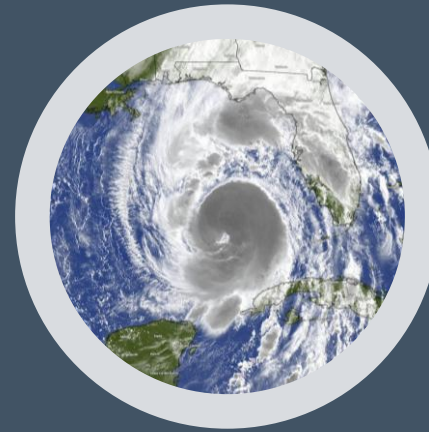

Storm surge - Helene brought a record-breaking storm surge to Manatee County, with peak surges of 5.5–7 feet. The storm surge flooded barrier islands and left behind mountains of sand.

High water records - Helene produced high water records in several locations, including St. Petersburg, Cedar Key, Clearwater Beach, Old Port Tampa, Port Manatee, and Venice Inlet.

Catastrophic damage - Bradenton Beach was buried in catastrophic damage, including the loss of beaches and sand dunes, and damage to residential, commercial, and government property.

Evacuations - Emergency crews evacuated more than 300 people from Anna Maria Island, Palmetto, and unincorporated areas of the county.



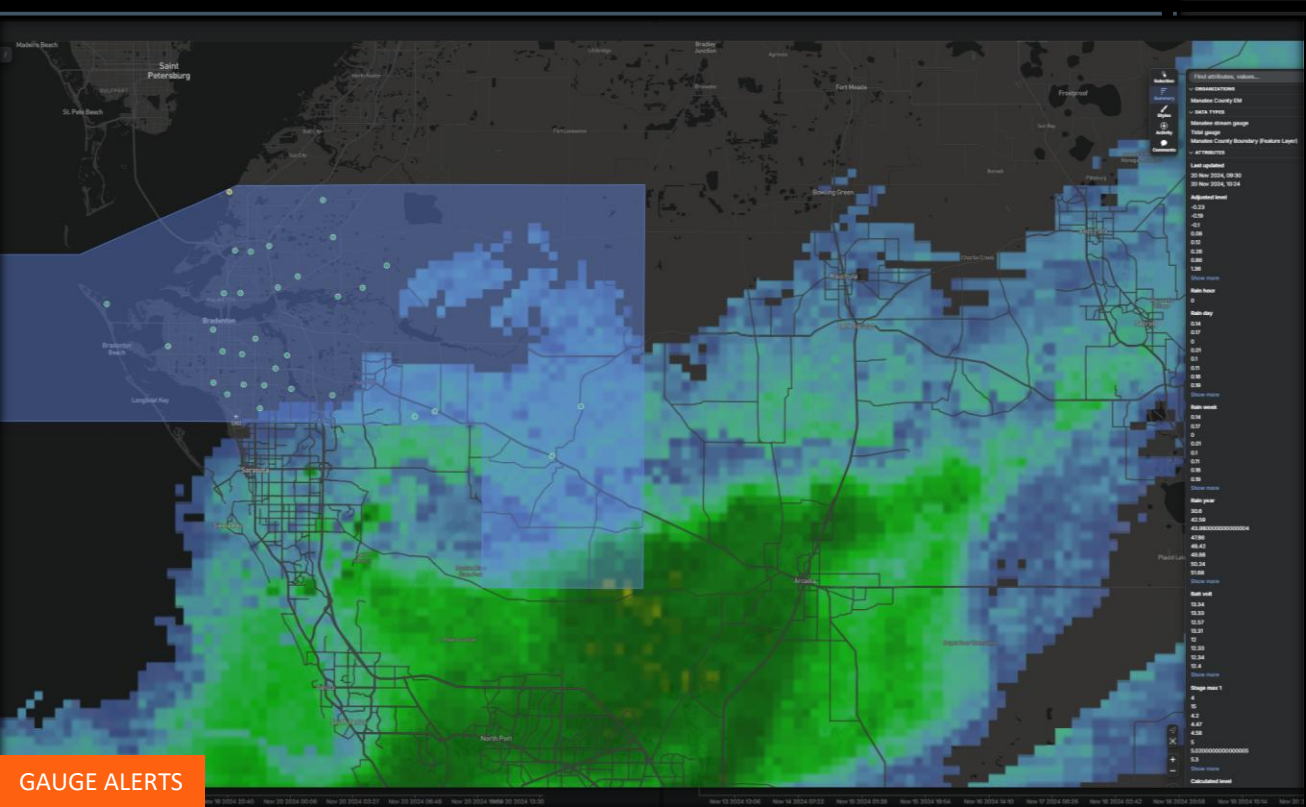
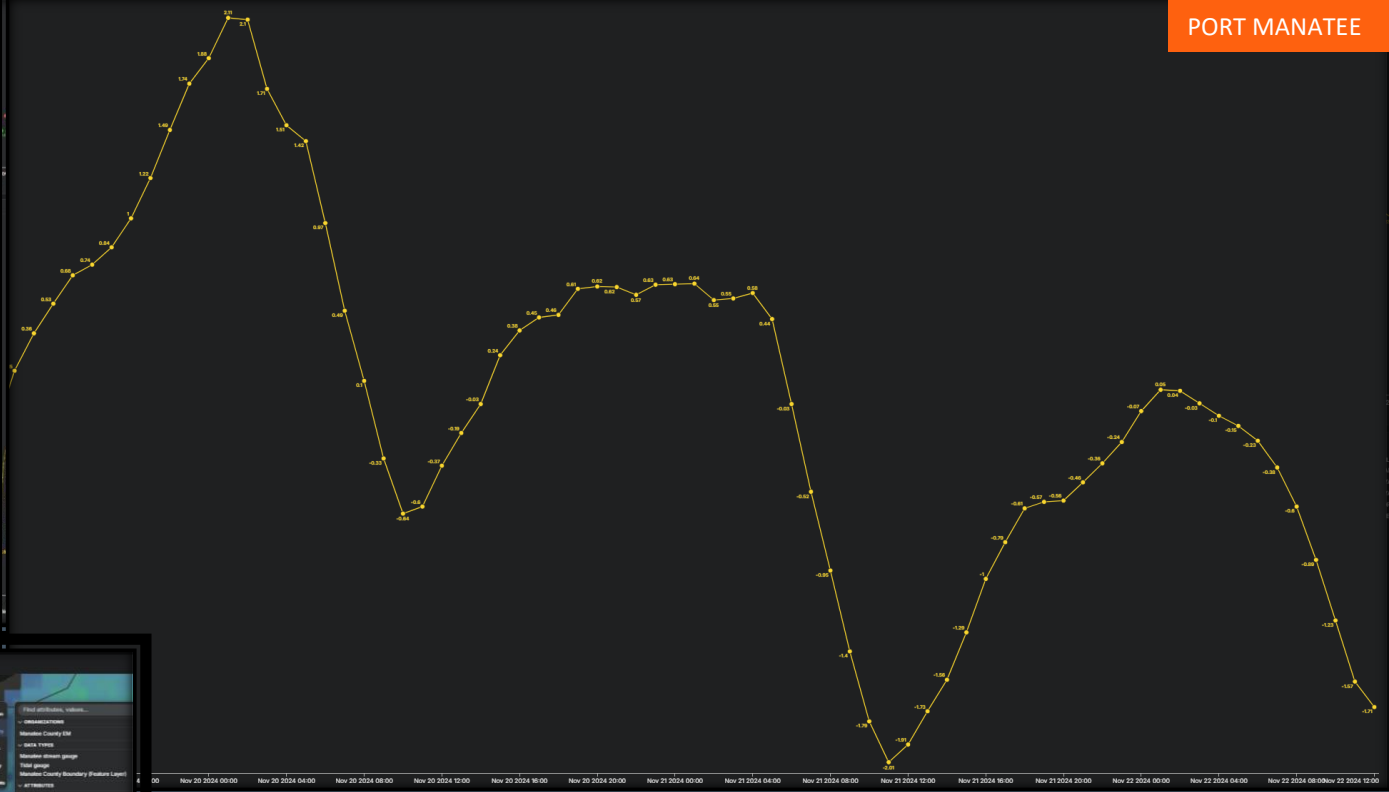

TIDAL/DAM/RIVER GAUGES

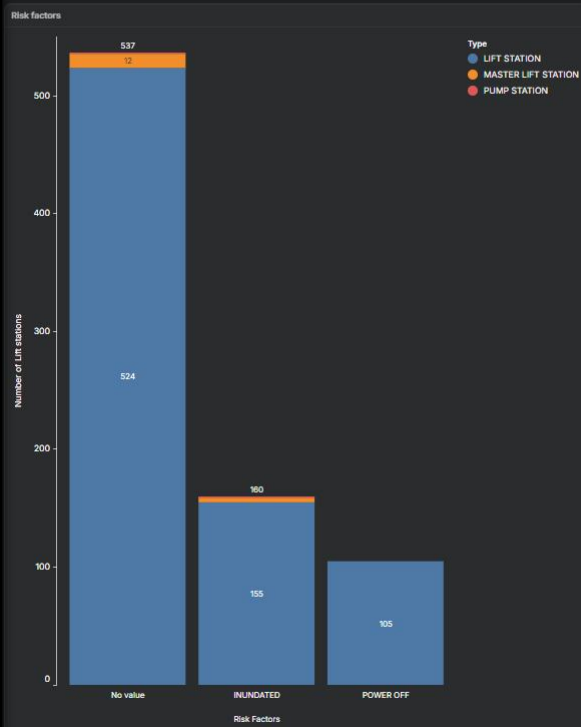
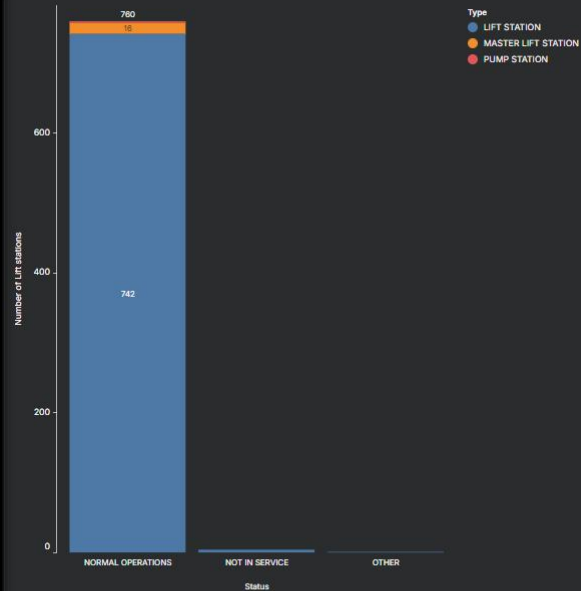


PORT MANATEE

Recovery Phase



Damage Assessment:

Evaluate the extent of damage to homes, infrastructure, and utilities.



Restoration:

Restore essential services such as power, water, and transportation systems.



Financial Assistance:

Facilitate disaster relief funding and assistance programs for affected individuals and communities.



Debris Removal and Cleanup:

Clear debris to enable safe return to normalcy.

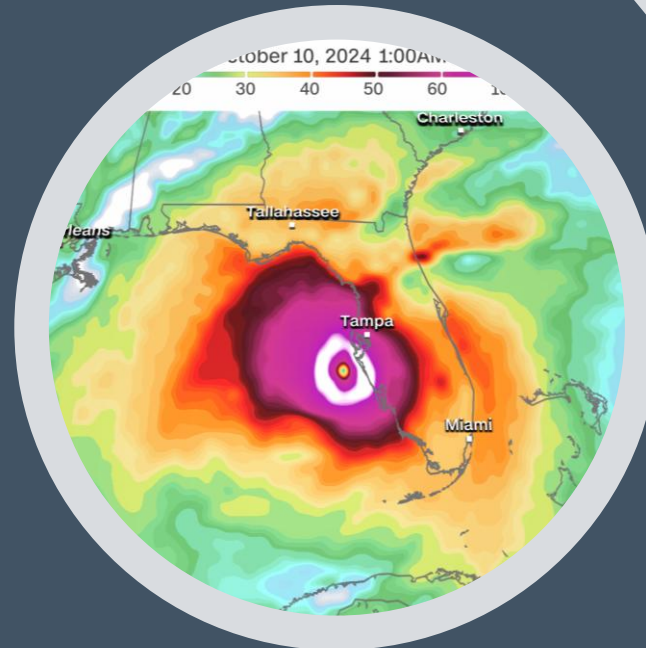
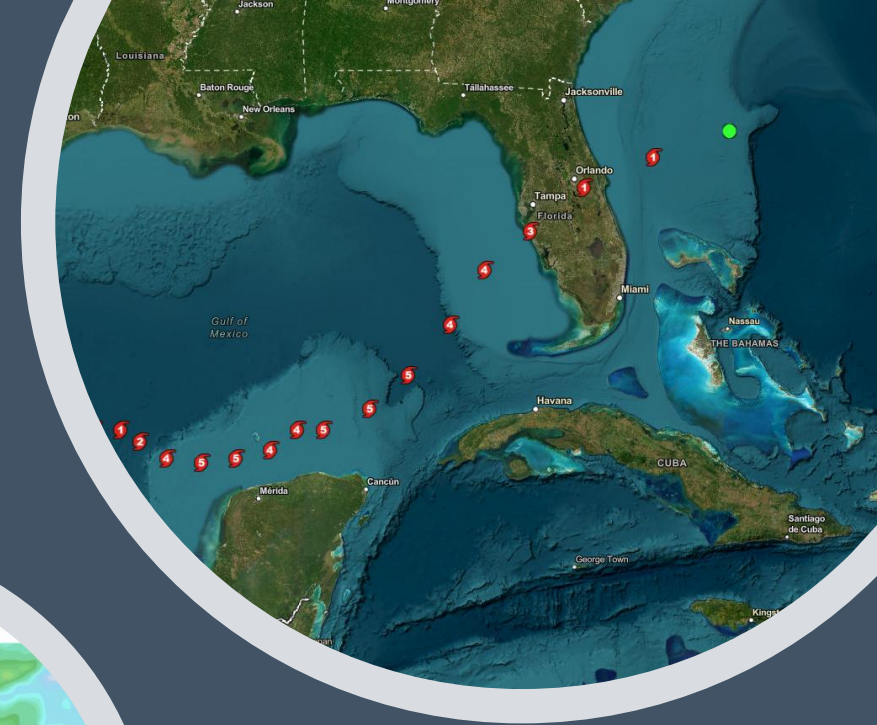
Wind - Hurricane Milton brought intense winds to Manatee County, Florida, causing significant damage and debris.

Sarasota Bradenton International Airport - The strongest gust of wind recorded at the airport was 102 mph, but the wind gauge was broken, so the actual wind speed was likely higher.

EyeWall - Northern part of eyewall effected Manatee County, looking at damages and estimated windspeeds of up to 120mph.

Debris - The extreme winds left debris on top of homes and businesses throughout Manatee County.

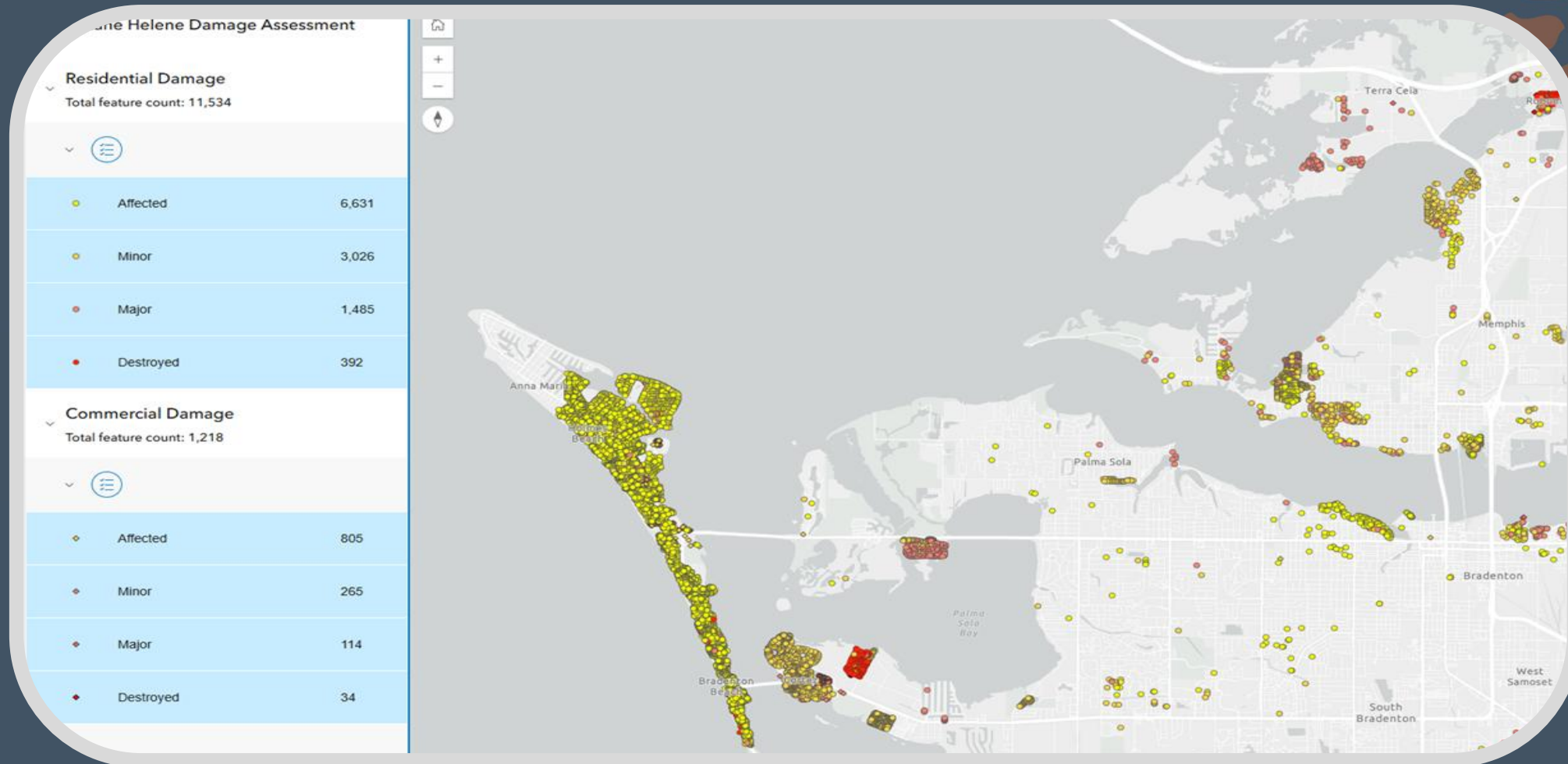
Hurricane Milton - The first hurricane to make landfall in the Sarasota-Manatee County area in over a century.

DEBBY – Old Damage Assessment View

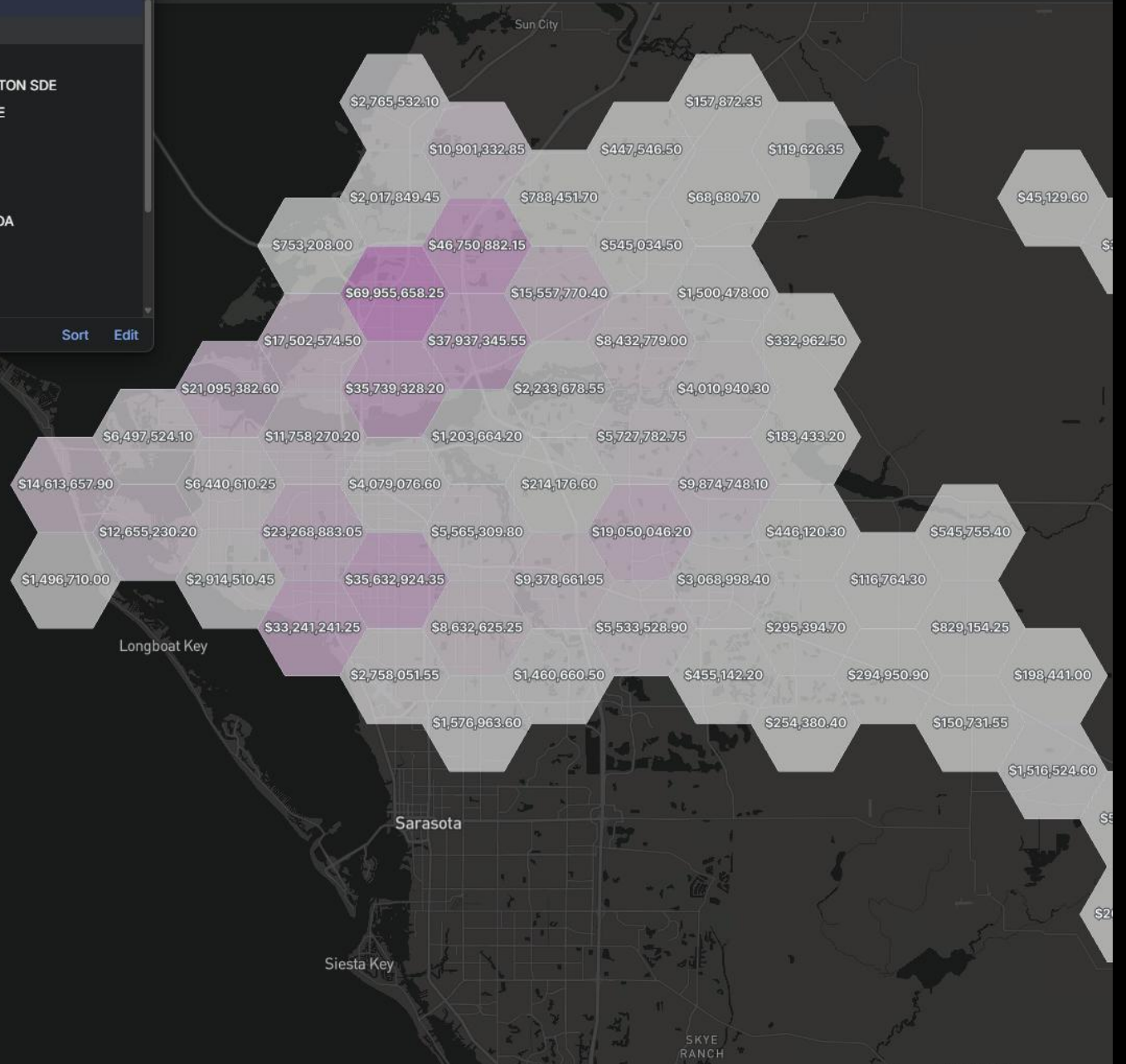
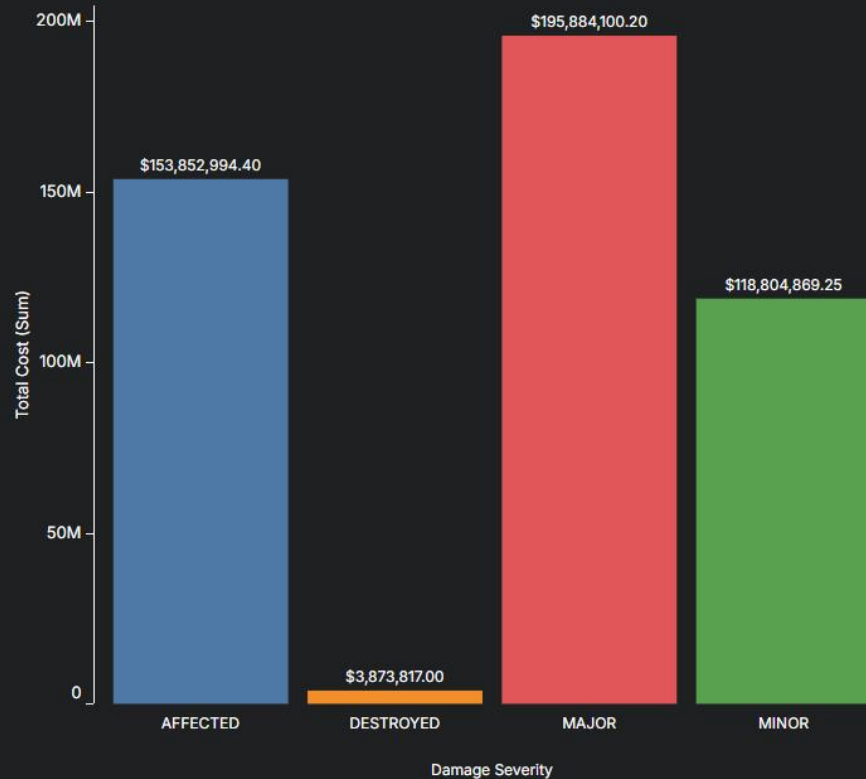

- Data Dictionary, retention, access and archiving procedures.

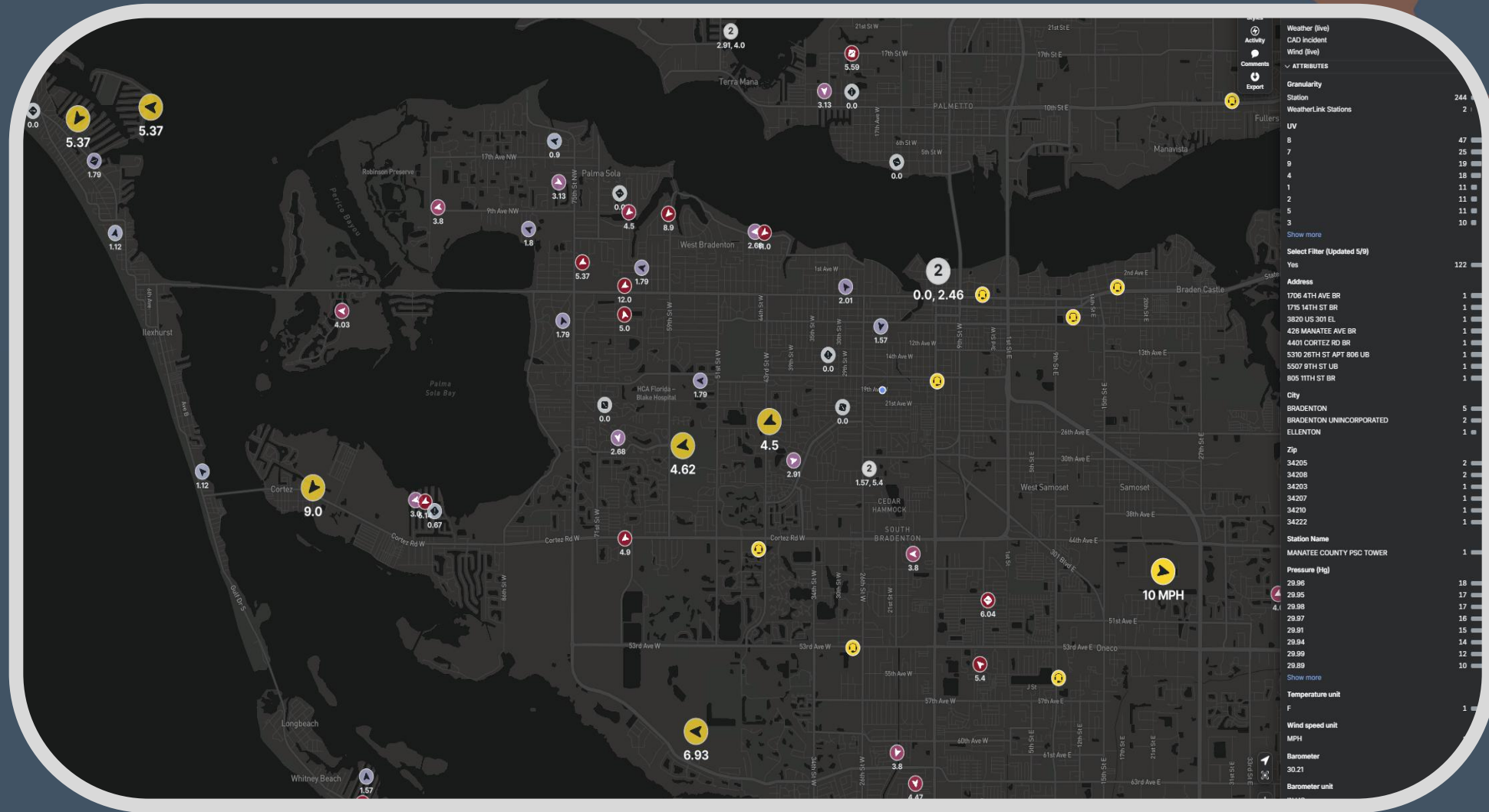

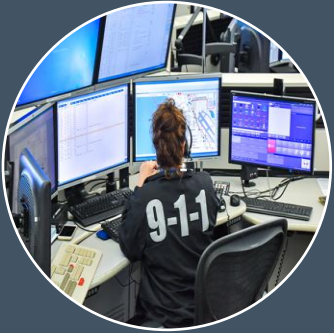

Strategically extracted keywords from 911 transcriptions are displayed on a live map, providing real-time insight into emerging incidents.



Live Dam Data:

Monitor real-time dam flow and lake levels with smart alerts that notify Emergency Management when thresholds are breached.



Automated Lift Station Data

Real-time SCADA integration replaces two manual processes, streamlining data collection and improving response time.



Video Feeds

Provide real-time video feeds from the island and portable devices used by FIT teams and high-water vehicles.
