Attached is the 7am Tropical Depression 10 briefing from NWS Tampa. The forecast is now anticipating that TD10 will be a Cat 1 hurricane upon landfall as this system slowly develops. Our chances of tropical force winds locally have gone up due to the increase in expected intensity. Though Charlotte County is not in the cone of uncertainty, it is important that we communicate that impacts can and are felt well outside of the forecast cone. Landfall is expected Tuesday night or Wednesday somewhere between Hillsborough County and Bay County but most of the weather from TD10 is likely to be east of its center.

Key Points:

- Chances for tropical storm force winds have increased for Charlotte County to 41% and 12% for strong tropical force winds.
- There is a flooding threat for all of the west coast of Florida from Monday night thru Wednesday due to the potential for heavy rainfall. Up to 4" countywide rainfall with areas near the coast seeing 6' of higher. Locally higher are always possible.
- A hurricane hunter aircraft is set to fly the system this morning which should provide important data for forecasts.

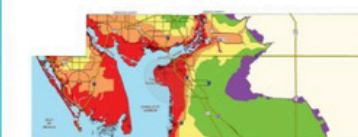

Self-Care

It's is not a sprint, it's a marathon

- **Take breaks and have a coverage plan in place so you can rest**
- **Practice what you preach (ensure you and your family are prepared so you can focus)**
- **Exercise together quarterly (this boosts confidence and reduces stress)**

Lessons Learned Tactics

- **Have pre-written posts for each phase of a disaster**
- **Use graphics to share the actions people need to take**
- **Use pictures and videos and show people what is going on**





BE SAFE WITH FLOOD WATER CLEANUP

AFTER THE CLEANUP

- After completing the cleanup, wash your hands with soap and warm water.
- Wash all clothes worn during the cleanup in hot water and detergent. These clothes should be washed separately from uncontaminated clothes and linens.

BEFORE YOU START CLEANING



- Take photos or video
- Keep records of all expenses.
- Check with your insurance company for other requirements needed to make your claim.

INSIDE THE HOME



- Keep children and pets out of the affected area.
- Wear rubber boots, rubber gloves, and goggles during cleanup.
- Private wastewater systems should be professionally inspected and serviced if damaged.
- Seek immediate medical attention if you become injured or ill.

HEALTH RISKS



- Flood waters and standing waters pose various risks, including infectious diseases, chemical hazards, diarrheal diseases, and injuries.
- Eating or drinking anything contaminated by flood water can cause diarrheal disease.
- Flood waters may contain sharp objects, such as glass or metal fragments, that can cause injury and lead to infection.
- Avoid exposure to floodwater if you

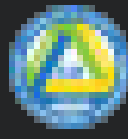

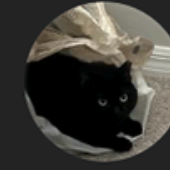

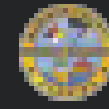
